1 THE ESSENTIAL SKILLS FOR CAREERS IN THE SKILLED TRADES AND TECHNOLOGY

SCC is currently working with Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) in order to bring awareness to the importance of Essential Skills that are absolutely crucial for success in the workforce. Part of this ongoing initiative requires the integration and identification of Essential Skills in contest descriptions, projects, and project documents. The next phase and very important aspect of our Essential Skills (ES) initiative is to provide an ES report card to each competitor at the Skills Canada National Competition. The purpose of the ES report card is to inform the competitor about their current level of essential skills based on their competition scores. With this knowledge, the competitor will be made aware which essential skill may require improvement. Full implementation is expected in the 2017 Skills Canada National Competition.

The following 9 skills have been identified and validated as key essential skills for the workplace in the legend below:

¹Numeracy, ²Oral Communication, ³Working with Others, ⁴Continuous Learning, ⁵Reading Text, ⁶Writing, ⁷Thinking, ⁸Document Use, ⁹Digital

These essential skills have been identified with in section 2.4 and/or 3.2 of your Contest Description. The top three Essential Skills for your area of competition have been identified on your Project and all other supporting project documents.

2.2 Purpose of the Challenge.

The principal function of an aesthetician is to give beauty care to persons with the main purpose of improving their appearance as well as giving the people a physical and psychological well being. By general means, the essential part of this work is to treat different parts of the body including specific care to facial skin, specific care for the hands, specific care of the body, and the application of makeup, while demonstrating professionalism and complying with occupational health and safety.

2.3 Duration of contest.

12 hours

2.4 Skills and Knowledge to be tested.

- **Advanced Facial**
The competitor will demonstrate an advanced facial using the sponsor's products and machines
- **Manicure with nail art**
The competitor will demonstrate a manicure using Sponsor's products and will duplicate the nail art. ⁸
- **Body Therapy Treatment with Hair Removal**
The competitor will demonstrate knowledge and understanding of a body treatment including cleansing, exfoliation, Swedish massage, and lower leg hair removal with wax ⁷
- **Make – up (Bridal to Creative)**
The competitor will duplicate the makeup look posted on the web site and then display their vision board according to creative theme (Las Vegas Showgirl) and add creative design according to guidelines posted on website.

3.2 Tasks that will be performed during the contest:

Manicure with Nail Art

- Objectives: Perform a manicure which includes, nail shaping, cuticle work, hand exfoliation, arm and hand massage, and application of nail lacquers. Nail art to be applied according to Test Project posted on SCC website.

Note: Nail art must be free hand using only the nail art brushes and dotter supplied by the Sponsor. Decals, polish with built in striper brush, corrector pens, guideline tape, or any other tool will not be allowed. Nail art brushes may not be adjusted in any way.

Body Therapy Treatment with Hair Removal on Lower Leg

- Objectives: To perform a body treatment that includes: cleansing, exfoliation, and 30 minute Swedish massage to back and back of legs. Hair removal using soft wax is to then be completed on lower leg, including the knee.

Bridal Make Up to Creative Aspect (Las Vegas Showgirl theme)

- Objectives: Duplicate the makeup look as posted (in the project). The makeup should be applied as an exact duplicate according to the picture provided. Artificial lashes must be applied to complete the look before the creative aspect is started. After the first judging, competitors will then display their vision board and then continue with the application of the creative aspect presented on their vision board.

Advanced Facial with Electrotherapy

- Objectives: Perform an advanced facial treatment using electrotherapy that meets the needs of the client's skin. The skin must be analyzed, findings recorded on the provided technical chart and the facial must be based on that analysis. *This will be part of the essential skills component.

Note: It is the candidate's responsibility to prepare for the competition by becoming familiar with the products and machines (refer to 4.1) to be used during the competition.

Upon arrival at the Skill area, Competitors will participate in a Safety workshop and they will be expected to work and maintain a safe working area during the competition. Any Competitor breaking any health, safety and environment rules, may be required to undertake a second safety workshop, this will not affect the Competitor's competition time.

7.1 Consecutive translation

7.2 Tie (No ties are allowed)

In the event of a tie, the candidate with the highest score in the Advanced Facial criteria will be declared the winner.

In the event of a second tie, the competitor with the highest score in the Body Therapy Treatment criteria will be declared the winner.

7.3 Test Project change at the Competition

Where the Test Project has been circulated to Competitors in advance, NTC shall change a maximum of 30% of the work content. Please refer to the Competition Rules.
