- 74% of employers find Essential Skills relevant to their business (ABC Life Literacy, 2013)
- Employers report that graduates entering their workplace have only 30% of the Essential Skills needed for the job
- Canadians aged 16-24 rank below average in their literacy and numeracy skills compared to 23 other countries (OECD, 2012)
- In Canada, approximately 28% of your earnings is directly related to your Essential Skills
- Apprentices with the Essential Skills they need for their trade are eight times more likely to pass their technical exams

Having an employee with higher level of Essential Skills is much more valuable to potential employers because the individual will have:

- an attention to safety
- the ability to work in a team setting
- a greater aptitude in problem solving
- improved client service skills
- an ability to adapt to change
- an advanced knowledge of numerical skills, including estimation, budgeting and calibrations

Skills shortages remain a significant challenge in Canada. Our country supports initiatives that help ensure Canadians have the Essential Skills needed to participate fully in the labour market and in their communities.
