1. PROJECT INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose of the Challenge.

Candidates will manipulate the block for a dress with 2-piece collar and set in sleeves to include required design elements (see below) and construct a transformative dress. Transformative means that 2 looks must be achievable by adapting how the garment is worn. This may include, but is not limited to:

- Additional garments
- Ability to alter shape
- Adding or removing components
- Adaptability in the way that dress is worn
- The dress should be suitable for a young working professional

1.2 Duration of contest.

When planning the design details, candidates should consider the time frame of the competition. Entire dress must be completed in 12 hours⁷.

2. CONTEST DESCRIPTION

2.1 Before competition.

- Candidates must prepare and bring a colour fashion illustration of their proposed dress design mounted on a stable illustration medium (such as foam core or bristol board): 28cm X 43cm, suitable for display. Points will be deducted if drawing is not available at orientation or not mounted as per specifications above.
- Candidates must also use the watermark croquis, provided on the Skills Canada website, to complete a front and back technical drawing of each of the 2 looks on separate pages. It is intended that the drawings be completed directly on the watermark croquis page. The technical drawings⁸ must be completed in pencil, and include a 2 piece collar, 15cm placket and set in sleeve as per the basic dress block.

2.2 During the competition.

- Competitors will be provided with a dress block⁸.
- Competitors must **NOT** alter the following mandatory components of the dress block, and the final construction must reflect the dimensions of the pattern:
 - Sleeve cap
 - Armhole shape
 - Collar/stand
 - Neckline and placket

- Shoulder length
- The length of the dress must finish between 10cm above the knee and 20cm below the knee, for both looks. It should be noted that the block ends at the knee line.
- Projects that do not include all the mandatory requirements will be marked as incomplete⁵.

2.3 Design components⁵ (level of difficulty and execution of design components will be considered when judging)

- Two different fabrics will be provided. Both fabrics must be used within the dress design of both looks.
- Design must incorporate the transfer or conversion of ALL darts.
- At the beginning of day one of the competition, a zipper length and zipper style (i.e. centre slot, invisible, lap, etc.) will be drawn. This zipper can be used decoratively, and/or functionally in the design. (essential skill 1 and 7) Competitors must incorporate this element appropriately into their technical drawing, pattern and garment. Note: additional zippers will be available for use as per contest description document.
- Design must include two symmetrical pockets.
- Competitors must include two of the following design components: yoke, overlay, design lines, extra vent(s) (other than vent or slit element), tabs, epaulettes, belt, added fullness (eg. pleats, gathers, tucks), extra pockets, etc.
- Additional design components contributes to the level of difficulty and will contribute to the potential of total marks (see marking criteria document)
- Appropriate hem treatment for design must be incorporated
- Block for dress with 2pc collar and set in sleeves⁵:
- Dress pattern includes 1.2cm seam allowances
- Pattern pieces:
 - dress front
 - dress back
 - Upper collar
 - Under collar
 - Collar stand
 - Placket
 - Sleeve

3. MATERIAL

3.1 Material provided by Skills/Compétences Canada:

Candidates are limited to the items in the supply list. Mandatory template outline (croquis) for technical drawing submission form is available online.

- dress supplies:
 - 2.5m approximately 115 cm wide light weight woven fabric, in each fabric
 - Interfacing
 - Pattern paper
 - Zippers (regular zippers in two lengths TBD; maximum 4 zippers per competitor, excluding the mandatory zipper)
 - Snaps (hand sewn) – size 1 (max 10 sets per competitor)
 - 2cm wide Velcro (max 30cm length)
 - Hooks and eyes (max 6 sets per competitor)
 - Thread

3.2 Fabric swatches, and dress block are available through the Provincial or Territorial Skills Offices by February 15, 2019.

4. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Contestants must bring their project from their provincial competition. The provincial project must be finished and pressed. Competitor will be penalized if they do not have the project at the orientation. We will provide a display location for the project(s) during the national competition.
