Sho Sho is a contemporary artist using traditional techniques to create textiles that have been featured in Museums around North America. Winning numerous awards from Museums she was the first ever to show on Paris' Famous Eiffel Tower, selected as 1 of 7 in the world to represent Canada in France.

Sho Sho uses new and repurposed fur and leather and has an ecstatic to use rich natural fibres along with 24 K gold and platinum. Sho Sho was part of the exhibition "Native Fashion Now", which showed in several museums across the United States including the Smithsonian's Museum of the American Indian in New York.
