COMPETITOR SELECTION PROCESS

Identifying the WorldSkills Team Canada Competitors

Competitors will be selected from the results of the Team Canada Category being hosted at the Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC) 2022, in Vancouver. The winners of this category will be invited to join WorldSkills Team Canada (WSTC) 2022 and represent Canada at the 46th WorldSkills Competition in Shanghai, China in October of 2022.

1.1 Eligibility

To take part in the Team Canada category that will be held during SCNC Vancouver 2022, competitors must be registered by a Member Organization (MO). It is the responsibility of the MOs to ensure that registered competitors meet the following eligibility criteria.

1.1.1 Eligibility Criteria

To be invited to be a member of the WSTC, competitors must meet the WorldSkills (WS) eligibility requirements: Competitors must not be older than 23 in the year of the WorldSkills Competition (WSC) 2022. Exceptions exist in Mechatronics, Aircraft Maintenance, and Cloud Computing where competitors must not be older than 26 in the year of the WSC.

1.2 Competitors will be selected from the following SCNC Skill Areas to participate on WorldSkills Team Canada 2022:

1.3 The candidates will be chosen based on the following:

The candidates will be chosen based on the following: The competitor with a rank of 1st place in the Team Canada Category at SCNC 2022 will be invited to join WorldSkills Team Canada. Should a candidate decline the invitation, the invitation may be extended to the next competitor in line from 2nd to 4th place in order of results and based on a score that meets a Canadian Standard. If the competitors from 1st to 4th place do not accept the invitation to participate, SCC will not send a competitor to the WorldSkills Competition in that skill.

WorldSkills Team Canada Training/Preparation Period

Once the competitors are selected, they, with the help of their Expert, Trainer, MO and SCC National Secretariat (NSEC), will train and prepare to compete at the WSC in Shanghai, China. Skills/Compétences Canada (SCC) will provide a training budget to assist in offsetting relevant training costs.

WorldSkills Competition Skills Areas

In order for WS to host a skill, it must reach a minimum number of competitors. If this number is not reached, the skill will not be hosted. Each WS Member Organization must provide their participation list one year before the WSC. Therefore, the participation list is subject to change.

NOTE: Given the ongoing COVID-19 health crisis as well as other factors, the above selection criteria may be modified at any time upon a decision of a committee comprised of the Official Delegate, Technical Delegate, Technical Delegate Assistants, and CEO of SCC.
