Skills/Compétences Canada to Host Industrial Mechanics in Brampton, ON, for WorldSkills Competition 2022 Special Edition

OTTAWA, ONTARIO, October 12, 2022 - Skills/Compétences Canada, the Canadian Member Organization of WorldSkills, will be hosting Industrial Mechanics for the WorldSkills Competition 2022 Special Edition (WSC2022SE) from October 17 to 21, 2022 at the Sheridan College, in Brampton, Ontario. WSC2022SE is the official replacement for WorldSkills Shanghai 2022, cancelled in May due to the pandemic. There will be a total of 62 skill competitions held over 12 weeks in 15 countries and regions between 7 September and 26 November 2022 hosted by the WorldSkills global network.

What: The Industrial Mechanics competition for the 2022 WorldSkills Competition Special Edition

> will be held at the Sheridan College, on the Davis campus, in Brampton, Ontario, from October 17 to 21, 2022. This is the only competition that will be hosted in Canada. Medals

will be awarded to the WorldSkills Champions at the Closing Ceremony.

The WorldSkills Competition is the largest and most influential skills competition. It represents the best of international excellence in the skilled trades and technologies. Young competitors across the globe compete with the goal of earning the title of world champion.
