many events and programs. SCC's 13 Member Organizations, which are in each province and territory in Canada, continue to connect with thousands of youth in Canada each year through their programs and activities.

We are appreciative to have great volunteers and partners who make it possible to host these events each year, allowing us to reach our future skilled workforce and grow the skills movement. SCC's many alumni also continue to inspire youth through their skills journeys and participation. We look forward to engaging more young Canadians and **#CreatingPossibilities** for their future. #CreatingPossibilities Through the Skills Canada Virtual National Competition




- Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Skills/Compétences Canada's (SCC) held its annual flagship event on a virtual platform on June 15th, 2021. At the Skills Canada Virtual National Competition (SCVNC), SCC welcomed hundreds of students, apprentices, teachers, parents, and career seekers along with industry leaders, government officials and television celebrities. SCVNC offered virtual career exploration activities for visitors and through this platform were able to demonstrate the many opportunities available in the skilled trades and technologies. **#SCVNC2021**
- SCC hosted virtual competitions for students and apprentices across Canada in 37 Skill Areas, from May 25-30, 2021. This included 27 post-secondary competitions which took place over the course of two days and were held live online via ZOOM, and 25 secondary competitions of one day, which were held on Google Classroom and recorded. Highlights of these competitions, including video footage and photos, were featured during the event.

- SCVNC also hosted digital content, including 150 videos which spotlighted our partners, alumni and industry celebrities. This included Tips and Tutorials from Industry Professionals on Skills (TTIPS) videos featuring SCC partners, *Trading Trades* demonstrations featuring SCC’s alumni; Skills for Success Stage activities focused on this year’s theme *Digital*; an **#EndSkilledTradesStigma** chat with TV celebrity Sherry Holmes, a Q&A session with TV celebrities Kate Campbell and Sebastian Clovis, a video presentation about *Women in the Trades: Stigma, Underrepresentation, and Inclusion* with Mandy Rennehan, CEO of Freshco (not the grocery store!) and much more.
- SCC welcomed over 70 booths with national industry, government and education partners. In addition, visitors could chat with their local Skills Canada representatives and check in on SCC’s Skills for Success booth to learn more about these important programs. Over 1,200 visitors from across Canada signed in to the vFairs platform on the day of the event to engage with sponsors and Skills Canada Member Organizations.
- SCC held a fun scavenger hunt and trivia challenge for youth where participants won great prizes while learning about skilled trade and technology occupations.



- Following SCVNC, there was a virtual awards ceremony where the winning medalists were announced.
- SCC also shared information on their social media platforms and the venue’s social media wall throughout the day including **Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, YouTube** and **LinkedIn**, using **#SCVNC2021** hashtag, and had a total of **231,220 impressions**. In addition, this campaign reached over **300,000 people**.
- SCVNC was an opportunity to celebrate skills and bring awareness of skilled trade and technology careers to Canadian youth while highlighting the many opportunities that exist. Thank you to our **partners**, alumni and special guests for helping us host such a successful event!

Students Engaged in Career Exploration and Discovery During Let's Talk Careers Competition



- Skills/Compétences Canada renewed their partnership with Let's Talk Science to engage students in career discovery and exploration. Schools and students across Canada had the chance to learn about careers by participating in the Let's Talk Careers Competition, on the **ChatterHigh** platform.
- This competition was held in the Fall of 2021 and had over:
 - ◇ 6,000 participants from more than 200 schools;
 - ◇ 115 districts across Canada;
 - ◇ 544,704 web pages to explore post-secondary, career, and labour market information;
 - ◇ 375 students won bursaries.
- The Let's Talk Careers Competition engaged students across Canada in career discovery by engaging them in exploring existing and emergent careers in skilled trades, technologies and STEM (science, technology, engineering and math). While participating in this competition, students learned about career and post-secondary options available to them by matching their passions and interests to post-secondary programs or directing them to work options.
- Students had the opportunity to answer a quiz each day which allowed them to explore thousands of career options that they may not have been exposed to, and also the opportunity to win prizes.

Youth Explored Careers During National Skilled Trade and Technology Week

- Skills/Compétences Canada (SCC) officially launched the 17th National Skilled Trade and Technology Week (NSTTW) on November 2nd, 2021, at a Virtual Career Exploration Event. This event brought awareness to parents, youth, educators, and career seekers about the incredible skilled trade and technology career opportunities that are available across Canada.
- At this event, there were over 350 students, industry and education partners, industry celebrities, SCC alumni and many of Skills Canada's Member Organizations in attendance. Students had the opportunity to learn about career and education pathways in the skilled trades and technologies, interact with partners through text chat, answer trivia questions, check out SCC's virtual stage and learn about the 9 +1 Skills for Success. This year's theme was *Creativity & Innovation*, one of the **Skills for Success**. Student visitors could also participate in an exciting contest for a chance to win a DGI Mini 2 Drone.
- In addition, SCC in partnership with the RBC Foundation, held a panel discussion on **Crushing Barriers to the Skilled Trades** where participants discussed the misconceptions, best practices and required preparation when pursuing a career in the trades. Celebrity guests included Sam Effah, RBC Olympian, Sebastian Clovis, HGTV Celebrity and Siobhan Detkavich, Top Chef Canada competitor. This was followed by an engaging Q&A.
- SCC also shared inspiring content on their social media channels including SCC's **'I Love My Job' video series** which highlighted careers in the skilled trades and technologies and featured several of SCC's partners and alumni through TikTok and Reels style videos. These videos are available on SCC's **YouTube channel**.
- At this event, there were over 2,000 booth visits and over 1,700 video views.

On February 24, 2022, Skills/Compétences Canada (SCC) hosted Level Up! With Skills Canada, a one-day free interactive virtual career exploration event for students, teachers, parents, apprentices, and career seekers. 
PARTICIPANT SURVEY RESULTS

87% of participants agreed or somewhat agreed that by attending this event, they learned something about new career options in skilled trades and technologies.

81% of participants agreed that as a result of attending this event, their overall perceptions about careers in skilled trades and technologies are now very positive or somewhat positive.



Highlighting the Importance of Accessibility, Equity & Inclusion, and the Skills For Success

During the **National Skilled Trade and Technology Week 2021**, Skills/Compétences Canada (SCC) in partnership with the RBC Foundation, held a panel discussion on *Crushing Barriers to the Skilled Trades* with celebrity guests Sam Effah, Sebastian Clovis, and Siobhan Detkavich. They discussed unconscious and conscious biases when it comes to being a BIPOC individual within the industry.

At **Level Up! With Skills Canada 2021**, SCC held an Skills for Success Accessibility and Inclusion session featuring Marco Pasqua, a guest speaker who shared his experience as a person with a disability in the workforce. He discussed the importance of the nine Skills for Success and working towards inclusive workplaces across Canada.

During the Skills Canada Virtual National Competition (SCVNC) 2021:

- Industry celebrity Mandy Rennehan spoke about *Women in the Trades: Stigma, Underrepresentation and Inclusion*.

- RBC and SCC shared an announcement that they will be expanding their reach to youth in underrepresented communities. This program will allow organizations to leverage activities to increase diversity and inclusion in the industry.
- Competitor Liam Crane and trainer Sean Kettley shared their experience in the Abilympics and explained why inclusion and accessibility is important in workplaces and learning environments.
- At the Skills for Success (SFS) Stage, SCC promoted the new framework, and shared how to videos featuring Chris Gallant from SFS Thursdays and teacher resource classroom activities.
- SCC also held an Skills showcase of traditional First Nations, Métis and Inuit skills to celebrate the traditional skills of Indigenous people combined with contemporary skills currently used in the trades, and an Inuit Traditional Skills Showcase where Amanda Latreille showed the importance of preserving traditional Inuit skills.

I remember feeling a lot of relief, but also a lot of pride and excitement. Running to the podium with my Quebec flag in my hands and seeing the crowd applauding was an incredible moment. In addition, I received the medal from David Boivin, who had won the gold at the 2009 WorldSkills Competition, in Calgary, and who is now a good friend and colleague.

ADVICE FOR FUTURE GENERATIONS

Undoubtedly: listen to yourself! Instead of listening to their instincts, several people I know listened to the people around them, and ended up a few years later going back to school to follow their true passion. Also, take your time, do not rush things. Sometimes, after leaving school, being in a work environment that is not your ideal career can be very beneficial and give you important experience.

I am currently working at the Québec offices of LG2, in the production team. My tasks mainly consist in working with different mock-ups created by the art directors, and in making sure that all elements are well integrated, including alignment, colours and formats. I have had the chance to work on a wide variety of projects, and in multiple languages as well.

THE SKILLS JOURNEY

I got involved with Skills/Compétences Canada (SCC) in 2009, when I was in grade nine in high school. Every student went through a technical exposure class including computer aided design (CAD) drafting and electronics. Through this class, I met an instructor who wanted to start a robotics club to compete in the Skills Canada Saskatchewan provincial competition. My team mate, Bo Chiasson, and I competed in this provincial competition for three years. When we won, we progressed to the 2012 Skills Canada National Competition, in Edmonton. There we won gold and qualified to compete at WorldSkills Leipzig 2013. During the year leading up to this WorldSkills Competition, we also got the opportunity to compete at WorldSkills Americas 2012, in São Paulo, Brazil, where we took home gold! At WorldSkills Leipzig 213, we placed ninth in the world for Mobile Robotics.

Now, I am a Weapons Engineering Technician in the Royal Canadian Navy and have had success in my career which I attribute to my past involvement with SCC.

IMPACTFUL MEMORY

My favourite skills memory is that a few years after I competed at WorldSkills Leipzig 2013, there was another robotics team that came from my high school who got to compete at this international competition. They were able to experience the same opportunities that I did. It means a lot knowing that I encouraged others to achieve greatness for themselves.

ADVICE TO YOUTH

I would encourage youth to continually try new things to find what you like to do. There are so many great career options out there.

AND NOW

I am currently a Weapons Engineering Technician serving in the Royal Canadian Navy, based in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Maintaining training for sailing, equipment, and physical fitness in preparations to deploy overseas. There are a lot of benefits to being involved with the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF). 
