- 1 It begins with in-school competitions, supported by teacher encouragement.
- **2** Progress to regional competitions.
- (3) Approximately 5,000 youth advance to the provincial/territorial competitions.
- 4 Over 500 students compete at the Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC). The highest-ranking age eligible participant or team in identified Skill Areas at SCNC are selected to participate in the next stage of WorldSkills Team Canada.
- 5 The competitor or team in each identified Skill Area will participate in various training activities and a mental preparation program.
- 6 The competitor or team in each identified Skill Area will participate in a competition to achieve a predefined Canadian Standard as the last step in the WorldSkIlls Team Canada Qualification Process.
- (7) WorldSkills Team Canada members represent Canada at the WorldSkills Competition.
